5. Citizens Presentations

Mark Liepman addressed the Council concerning animal control in the City. He asked the Council to consider enforcement of the City's Animal Control Ordinance.

6. Approval Of Minutes Of Previous Meeting(s)

Alderman Stacy Watts offered the motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting(s). Alderwoman Pamela Teel seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion were Alderman Marcus Hafford, Alderwoman Teel, Alderman Watts, Alderman Steven Standley, and Alderman Dan Fussell. Motion carried.

7. Update on Police Department Activity

Mayor Hughes gave the update on the police department's activity for the month of February. Activity included: reports filed 52; 7 felony arrests; 12 misdemeanor arrests; 6 assist other agencies; 174 responses on calls for service; 0 juvenile case; 1 auto accident response/report; 24 citations; 34 warnings; and 0 completed mental health warrants.

8. Judge Loretta Biggers - Update On Municipal Court Activity

Mayor Hughes reported 21 citations and collections of \$169.00 for the month of February. Remitted to State - \$76.00 and City retention - \$93.00.

9. **Tracy Cox - Update on Main Street**

Tracy Cox updated the Council on Main Street activities. On March 2, Main Street celebrated Texas Independence Day and presented Texas flags to anyone who wanted one. Upcoming events – May 7 & 8 - Treasures on The Square and June 4 & 5 – Heritage Days.

10. **Discussion and After-Action Review Of The February 2021 Ice Storm As Related To The City Electric Grid**

City Manager John Camp and Electrical Supervisor Robert Lakey discussed the above item with the council. Mr. Camp reported that the ice storm we experienced in February caused power failures throughout the City. Contractors were called in to help restore power and within a week 90% of the services were restored. Several questions were asked by the council members and answered by Robert Lakey and Mr. Camp such as what happened during the storm, what actions were taken to repair damages and what could have been done to prevent the problems prior to the storm.

11. **Discussion and After-Action Review Of The February 2021 Ice Storm As Related To The City Water/Wastewater System and Street Department**

City Manager John Camp and Water/Wastewater Supervisor Chris Anding discussed the above item with the council. Chris Anding answered questions asked by the council concerning the ice storm such as whether there was a plan in place before hand to address issues that might come up because of the storm and what is being done to correct problems that resulted from the storm.
