7. Update on Police Department Activity

Chief Shannon Brazeal gave the update on the police department's activity for the month of March. Activity included: reports filed 55; 8 felony arrests; 6 misdemeanor arrests; 6 assist other agencies; 287 responses on calls for service; 0 juvenile case; 6 auto accident response/report; 56 citations; 162 warnings; and 0 completed mental health warrants.

The Code Enforcement department has issued 9 letters sent out giving violators 30 days to contact the department with a plan of action to correct the violations. There have been 3 responses.

8. Judge Jeff Cox - Update On Municipal Court Activity

It was reported that 48 citations were received and collections of \$2,317.00 for the month of March. Remitted to State - \$992.00 and City retention - \$1,325.00.

9. Tracy Cox - Update On Main Street Program

They actively working on the Heritage Days and provided information of this event. This week there will be the "Pop up Shops" in the downtown area. San Augustine will also be a stop on the Annual Sale on the Trail, with spaces available on the Courthouse square.

10. Update by City Manager Jeaneyse Mosby

City Manager Jeaneyse Mosby gave the council an update for the month of March:

- There was a leak in a 16-inch water line from the water plant that was repaired with no problems. It did not affect the storage tanks and only one resident was without water and the line was located in his driveway. It has been eleven years since this line had any issues, and it is on the list to be repaired with incoming grant funds.
- The Code Enforcement Department has started and have had responses from some of the letters issued.
- The Heavy Trash Pick-up Day that was funded by a grant from DETCOG and TCEQ was completed within 2.5 days. City employees Lewis Johnson and Mark Pitts were commended by DETCOG staff members for their performance during this event.
