

Boil Water Notice Rescinded
03/16/21

On 03/07/21, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality required the City of San Augustine public water system, PWSID 2030001, to issue a Boil Water Notice to inform customers, individuals, or employees that due to conditions which occurred recently in the public water system, the water from this public water system was required to be boiled prior to use for drinking water or human consumption purposes.

The public water system has taken the necessary corrective actions to restore the quality of the water distributed by this public water system used for drinking water or human consumption purposes and has provided TCEQ with laboratory test results that indicate that the water no longer requires boiling prior to use as of 03/16/21. The Ice Storm of February 2021 caused a total loss of pressure due to control failures and later several brakes. The City has verified the water is safe to drink after the pressure returned to normal. There was not specific finding of any contamination at any time that led to the boil notice which was precautionary in nature. The original boil notice had been previously rescinded, but unfortunately subsequent loss of pressure led the City to a second notice which is hereby rescinded.
